

"A Christianity that constantly talks about all the enemies it has that need to be conquered rather than all the neighbors it has that deserve to be loved is a Christianity that is following fear rather than Jesus."— Rev. Benjamin Cremer

Consider these questions: Who are your enemies? Who are your neighbors? Are these people ever the same?

Oftentimes, the people on our enemy list are those who disagree with our ideologies and theologies. These people don't tend to see the world with the same eyes/lenses as us. These folks don't likely vote like us. Maybe such folks don't look like us. Most of the times, these are the ones WE call THEY.

Cremer is right to help us re-center, re-focus. When all we see are enemies instead of neighbors, we are not seeing the world through the eyes of Jesus. Jesus says love your enemies. Jesus chastises his followers for drawing a sword. Jesus reminds us who will inherit the kingdom/reign of God. Jesus instructs us to visit the sick and prisoners, to give food and water to those in need.

Re-focusing on Jesus always brings us to love. Love is the center of the Christian faith.

Consider these questions: How can we show all people that we love them? Even in an election year? Everyday even? Will I allow my love to be greater than my fear?

The hymn says, They will know we are Christians by our love.

ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP

What are Microplastics? Microplastics are defined as any type of plastic less than 5mm in length. Where do microplastics come from? They come from larger plastic products that have partially broken down, from abrasion and wind, and even the friction of your car tires rubbing against the road when you drive. Some are even manufactured to be added to some cosmetics and cleaners. Plastic products like single-use plastic bottles have a lifespan of 450 years. Now imagine the countless other plastic products that also pollute the environment

There are many sources of these microplastics in our water supply, but most come from littering, storm water runoff, and poor wastewater management. Do you realize that you ingest these microplastic particles when you drink water? Each year the average American ingests more than 700,000 microplastics in their drinking water supply. If you think you are safe because you drink bottled water, you are not. Microplastics have been found in 90% of all bottled water sold to consumers everywhere. A recent study found microplastics in human blood. The possible health risks are frightening.

Again, we ask you to do whatever you can to reduce your use of plastic, and to responsibly discard it when no longer useful. We must all be better stewards of the environment. Remember, together we can make a difference!
